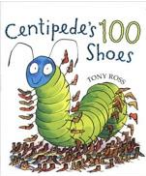


Mathematics

Measures – x1 week including calculating area of regular and irregular shapes.

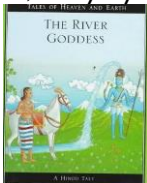
