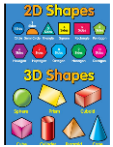


Mathematics

Light and Dark

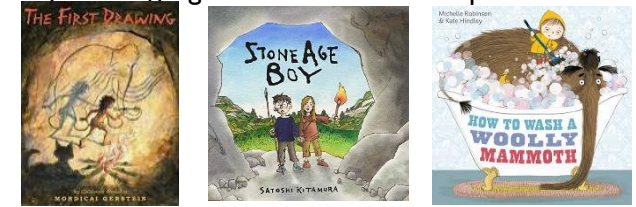

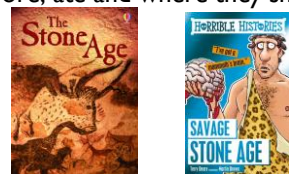
What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?
