Gross Motor Skills - Manipulation and Co-ordination

Children will:

Children will understand that we should respect and care **for the environment** (plants, animals, our school, the local environment).

Children will learn:

- Plants are important to our environment
- Different animals have unique habitats
- How and why our environment has changed over time
- Humans can have a positive or negative impact on our environment
- How we can work together to look after our environment

Expressive Art and Design

Children will enjoy a range of art and craft activities, focusing on the following:

- manipulating clay, planning and creating with purpose
- explore pattern, colour and texture in the environment
- Share ideas and create collaboratively

Communication and Language

Children will continue to practise:

- Following instructions with two or three parts
- Asking questions to further their understanding and answer questions appropriately

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Relationships

Children will continue to develop their understanding of:

- how to look after their bodies (e.g. teeth cleaning, healthy eating, self-care)
- how to manage risks safely (e.g. road safety)

Children will also continue to practise dressing, self-care routines and their self-regulation skills, demonstrating an increasing level of independence.

- Children will practise reading longer words, compound words and words ending in: - ing, -ed/t, ed and est
- Children will continue to practise writing sentences, inspired by our Drawing Club texts and their wonderful imaginations!
