
## **Overall Survey Results**

We are delighted that 97.9% of families strongly agree or agree their children are happy at School. We know it is important to our parents and carers that the children are happy; it is important to us too. We strongly believe happy children will develop a love of learning and be able to communicate their feelings and thoughts confidently at school and at home.


We have one family liaison officer Mrs Allen (FLO) and a Safeguarding officer, Mrs Baker, who are available to talk to children and adults about any well-being issues on a regular basis. We also very fortunate to have Mrs P Fiest our School counsellor and Mental Health First Aider as part of our wellbeing team. Also, please discuss any concerns that you may have with your class teacher or support adults as we are always here to help. As many of you know Joy Lane runs a plethora of successful interventions such as serenity, sensory circuits, or sanctuary to support wellbeing, either before school starts or during the school day.

As a school, we pride ourselves on the nurturing provision we provide for all our children and the welcoming environment we have created for them. Within this safe and secure space, children are taught beyond the curriculum and are coached through their emotions and choices on a regular basis. This holistic approach supports the children's emotional regulation and allows children to be better ready for learning.

#### 2. My Child feels safe at this school.



### 3. The School makes sure it's pupils are well behaved.



- Bullying is "behaviour by an individual or a group, repeated over time that intentionally hurts another individual either physically or emotionally".



What constitutes bullying behaviour, the consequences of this type of behaviour, and how to deal with certain behaviours, is part of the PSHE curriculum and a regular topic during class discussions as well as Anti-Bullying Week. Any bullying or unkind behaviours by children that do not follow our school ethos of being Ready, Respectful or Responsible will be dealt with following our behaviour policy. We would also kindly ask that parents and carers monitor their child's use of Mobile phones, messaging, Apps or PlayStation/X-box communications as unkind behaviour between children on these devices at weekends or after school can spill over and cause disruption in school or on the playground.






Our Forest School, indoor heated swimming pool, vast outdoor space, beautiful learning environment and outstanding music department complement the curriculum we offer at Joy Lane.


We are thrilled that so many parents appreciate the hard work and dedication of 'Team Joy Lane' and the positive partnership that is forged between home and school. Parents and carers have had the opportunity to attend a 'Meet the Teacher' session, as well as a Parent Partnership consultation in October, where expectations for the year were shared with parents and carers. We also hope that our recent 'Sharing Learning Afternoon' allowed you opportunities to see the children's fabulous learning and achievements.

You will shortly be receiving your child's interim report, and we encourage you to make contact with your child's Class Teacher if you have any queries regarding its content.

We encourage the children to challenge themselves and develop resilience in their learning. We use the 'voices for choices' animals (persevering parrot, go for it gorilla, exploring elephant, creative chameleon etc) to support our children in being able to reflect on themselves as learners.

The animals help the children learn new things, talk about their learning, and think about how they might do something better next time.




#### 9. My child does well at this School



Parents and carers will receive an Interim Progress Report at the beginning of February.

The main end-of-year report will be shared in July with detailed transition information prepared for the annual move to new classes before the end of Term 6. As usual a summary of your child's achievements across the curriculum will be shared with you.

- Pupils' understanding of the fundamental British values of democracy, individual liberty, the rule of law and mutual respect and tolerance.
- Pupils' confidence, resilience, and knowledge so that they can keep themselves mentally healthy.
- Pupils' understanding of how to keep physically healthy, eat healthily and maintain an active lifestyle.

The curriculum at Joy Lane is both wide, rich, and varied and offers exciting learning and enrichment opportunities such as Forest School lessons, regular swimming lessons with qualified swim instructors and fantastic music facilities. Our many local trips, including those to Harrier Lodge Care Home, the Life Boat station and Wildwood, allow the children opportunities to learn about and interact with the wider community beyond the classroom; children in years 5 and 6 also have the opportunity to experience residential trips. We take part in charity days and other community events and competitions to encourage compassion and respect in our children and show them how they can have a positive impact on others. The experiences on offer at Joy Lane are, in our opinion, excellent and go a long way to ensuring that pupils develop their skills in, and beyond, the classroom, equipping them for their life-long learning journey ahead.



It's great to see 89.3% of families feel their children can participate in additional school clubs & activities. However, it is slightly disheartening to hear 17% of families feel their children are not able to do so. If you are part of the 17%, we urge you to get in touch with the school to discuss why you feel this way. We try to make sure all of our additional curriculum clubs are inclusive and offer the same opportunities to all of our families. If there is a solution to reduce this 17% in the future, we are very keen to do so and will take all comments and suggestions on board for future arrangements.

During Terms 1 and 2 of the current academic year 2023-24, we have had over 250 pupils accessing our Extended Learning Clubs from Master Builders, Dance Club, Total Sports, Netball to Football, Homework Club, Music Club & Craft Club, and we are proud of our Joy Lane staff for providing these extra learning opportunities after school.


We are also looking to add more variety to our extra-curricular club list through local external providers.

As a school, we believe ourselves to be providing an inclusive environment where we support each individual to reach their full potential and to thrive. We do this through embedding the Mainstream Core Standards across the school and providing additional support for individuals, as needed. A child does not need to have a recognised SEND need to receive some of this support.


Where children require additional support that is above and beyond what is typically offered and available in class, they may be considered to have Special Educational Needs. In these situations, the class teacher would likely have had discussions with the SENCo and yourselves and a personalised plan (IPM) may be put in place. If you are still unsure, please discuss this with your child's class teacher in the first instance.

We are fortunate enough to have a large Inclusion Team at Joy Lane who work together to support the needs of each individual. Each class teacher has responsibility for the progress and development of each child in their care and they will liaise regularly with you to share updates; including progress towards Individual Provision Map (IPM) or Educational Health Care Plan targets (EHCP). This may be through Parent Consultations, telephone discussions, meetings, or Dojo. Where 36.4% of parents/carers are unsure around the support in place for their child, we would encourage you to contact their class teacher to discuss this further.

For the 4.5% that did answer this question and feel their children do not receive the right support, we would urge you to speak with your child's class teacher in the first instance to discuss your concerns. If you still feel your child's needs are not being met, please make contact with a member of the Inclusion Team: Mrs A Godden (Assistant headteacher for Inclusion), Mrs Pout (SENCo for Nursery and Reception), Mrs S Bowler (SENCo for Years 1-6) and Mrs L Crocombe (Lead Teacher for Oysters SRP).
