## Progress Update Report

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is with pleasure that I share a copy of your child's Interim Progress Report, which will give you a snapshot of their learning and development in Reading, Writing and Maths. This progress update is in addition to the more detailed end-of-year 'Report of Achievement' that you will receive in July 2024.

Your child's interim progress report will outline their behaviours for learning in line with our school ethos – *Ready, Respectful, Responsible* – and their current attainment in Reading, Writing and Maths. The children's attainment levels are based on our end of Term 2 data snapshot; the children are just beginning to work comfortably within the expectations of their new year group and programme of study, so please do not be alarmed if there is a slight dip in their outcomes compared to the previous year. For some children, they will be working on a Programme of Study that is below their year group, and this will be indicated on the report. The teachers' ongoing assessments will inform their planning and intervention groupings, and they will be tracking the children's progress closely to ensure they reach their learning potential.

At Joy Lane, we aim to develop strong home-school links as we know that we can get the very best from every child when school and home work in partnership. Your child's report will include a 'How can I help at home?' box with suggestions for how you can support the learning we are teaching in school.

If your child has an EHCP, please note that good progress towards each outcome has been indicated with a tick under the four areas of need, where appropriate.

We aim for this progress update to prompt a discussion about your child's progress and learning, so should you wish to clarify and discuss any aspects of the report, please make an appointment to speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance. We will not be holding parent/teacher appointments in a dedicated week in Term 4 but ask that you arrange a mutually convenient time for a more personalised meeting.

We hope that you value this feedback about your child's learning and progress at this mid-point in the year and find the recommendations helpful in supporting your child at home.
