OPAL PLAY – NEW STAGING PROJECT!

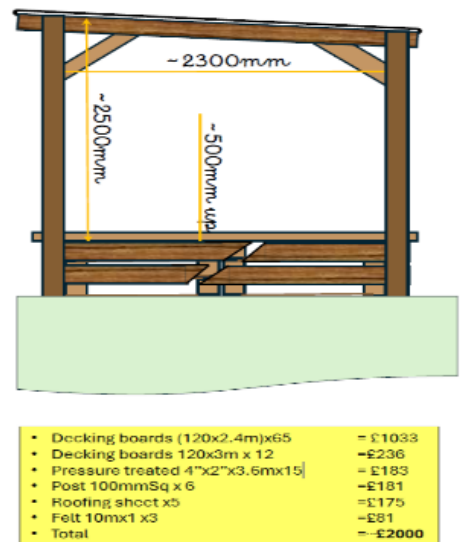
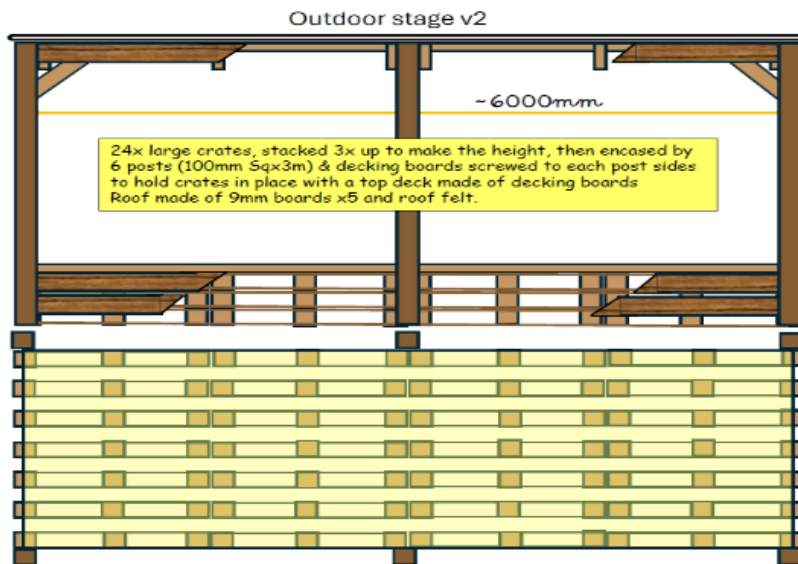


Project number two for OPAL is an Outdoor Performance Stage, which two members of our school community have offered to build over the summer holidays.

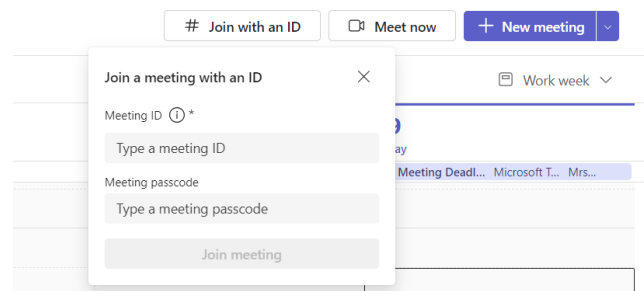
