

Mathematics

The children will explore weight and balance.

The children will notice, explore and continue repeating patterns using natural materials.

Physical, Social and Emotional

The children will be gently encouraged to express their emotions and any worries they may have, particularly about starting school.

The children will have access to a feelings jar linked to 'The Colour Monster' story in which they can colour their feelings, put them in the jar and discuss them with their key worker.

Literacy

The children will learn to use non-fiction books to find out new information.

The children will spot and suggest rhymes.

The children will clap and count the syllables in their name during our welcome time songs.

The children will learn to recognise their name and other words with the same initial sound. e.g. Robert and rainbow



Understanding the World

The children will continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.

The children will learn about different countries in the world and talk about the difference they have experienced or seen.

The children will begin to recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Communication & Language

The children will be encouraged to talk about places they have been to and heard about.

The children will continue to use new and extended vocabulary connected to different countries and cultures around the world.

The children will be encouraged to use joined up sentences when describing something familiar to them.

The children will be able to start a conversation and continue it for many turns and express a point of view.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will independently select resources they need for their own ideas.

Weekly Write Dance sessions. Use drawing to represent movement or noise.

The children will explore colour and colour mixing.

The children will begin to show different emotions in their drawings.

Explore musical instruments and perform.

Physical Development

The children will have independent access to a range of resources and equipment, including one-handed equipment such as scissors.

The children will collaborate together to manage large items such as moving a plank or carrying large blocks.

The children will be supported in holding a pencil in a comfortable grip.

The children will become increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed.
