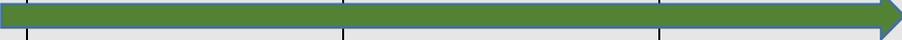

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Notation Specific

I can play my note from simple coloured pitch notation I can choose crotchets or quavers to notate my first name	I can create graphic notation to represent a sound I have played I can interpret different sized graphic symbols as different sized sounds	I can notate my one bar rhythm composition I can read and play a one bar crotchet and quaver rhythm	I can follow ukulele chord grid diagrams I can understand that <i>beats</i> can have 1 or more notes in them or silence	I can read and interpret colour notation without a conductor I can read guitar rhythm slashes and understand 4 beats per bar	I can recognise some notes in treble clef and follow the relative up and down movement I can use crotchet, quaver (+ semiquavers) to notate my rhythmic composition
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
