



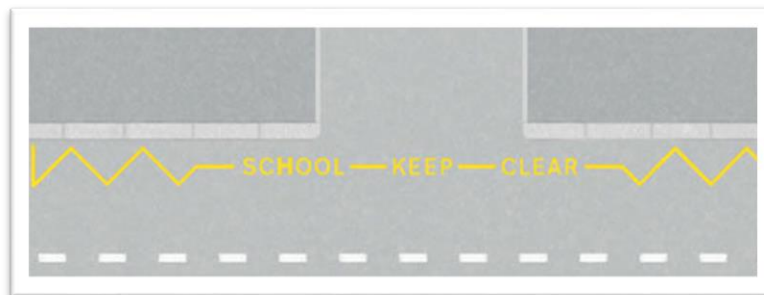

PROBLEM PARKING

While we appreciate that for some people using their car is the only option, this is having a real impact at the school gates. Parents illegally parking on the double yellow lines and zigzags are creating limited visibility for children and families to access walkways and to cross the road safely.

For the safety of the children and the whole school community, please can adults driving on Vulcan Close at drop-off and pick-up times ensure that you are parked safely and considerately and be aware that many of our children walk independently to and from school. Please may we also remind you to refrain from parking near the fire station entrance, on double yellow lines and in the Whitstable Day Nursery car parks, which are their private parking areas. Thank you for your consideration in these matters.
